## HRW Harvest Update

May 31, 2024

### Winter Wheat Headed by State

Texas - 100%  
Oklahoma - 100%  
Kansas - 94%  
Oregon - 73%

### State Updates

**CA** – harvest just getting underway in southern areas and dryland fields. Early reports are favorable with yields and quality.

**TX** – **HRW** harvest in southern regions is well underway in several areas with difficult conditions from storms. **SRW** harvest in the Black Soil area is on hold, being hammered by storms, including hail. Rolling Plains region is 70% harvested, but yields are above average with good test weights and average protein. Harvest should start in the Panhandle next week.

**OK** – Oklahoma wheat harvest continued to move forward in Southwest and Central Oklahoma this week at a slow pace, but rains in many parts of the state hindered progress that producers had hoped for over the past two days. Rain today will also delay harvest in most regions if not the entire wheat belt. There was minor change in yields (30 to 35 bu/a), test weight, and protein (~11%) from last week. The Oklahoma Wheat Commission is calling harvest 18% complete.

**KS** - As expected, test cutting has started in south-central Kansas with recent rain putting on the brakes for now, but welcome in the southwest region. Heading is ahead and most of the crop is turning color rapidly, indicating the crop overall is 7 to 10 days ahead of average.

The forecast calls for rain to end next week with a good stretch of dry weather.

**CO** – Winter wheat is a tale of two crops again with areas north of I-70 showing a mix of conditions but hoping for average production overall, pending the impact of severe storms with hail. South of I-70, the lack of moisture is showing a rough crop with potential for 50% abandonment. Expected yield is 20 to 30 bu/a in the southeast.

**OH** - Planted area in Ohio is lower than the past several years but with plentiful rains the crop looks good. No current concern about scab and the crop is moving toward an early harvest, starting later in June. Similar report on the Illinois crop that has good yield potential again. Some samples were collected in the South and Southeast this week.

**WY** – winter wheat crop is improving with timely rain and cool conditions and is currently 85% good to excellent. The crop is a week to 10 days behind average, but warmer weather expected next week will help the crop catch up.

**NE** - The Nebraska winter wheat crop progress is ahead of average and USDA estimates it at 20% excellent and 51% good. The crop is “hanging in” following recent rain in the south and central region but drier in the north and Panhandle. There is low-level stripe rust and wheat streak mosaic.

**SD** – Both the HRW and HRS crops look good in the state with each rated at 85% good-to-excellent. Winter wheat is about 10% headed; spring crop is 75% emerged, about normal for both classes.

**MN** – spring wheat crop is looking good at 82% good to excellent and is 96% planted, which is above average. Beneficial rain has helped alleviate dry conditions.

**ND** - HRS and durum are about 85% planted and 40% to 50% emerged, which is about average and crop condition looks good. Late seeding typically leaks into June, but it will need to dry out to finish planting. Durum planted area will be up this year.

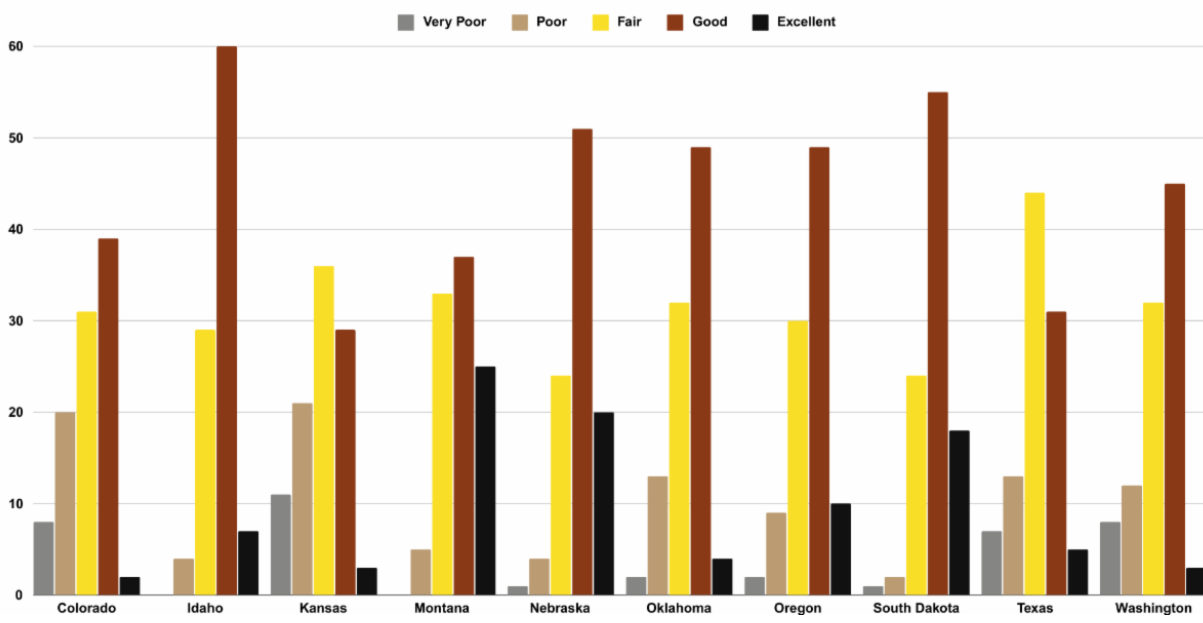
**MT** – May rain is improving the HRW conditions now rated 25% excellent up from 2% initially. Durum and HRS are 88% seeded. The 63% emerged is slightly ahead of average. Cool conditions continue.

**ID** – USDA estimates 67% of winter wheat is in good to excellent condition. The spring wheat crop is 96% seeded with 76% emergence.

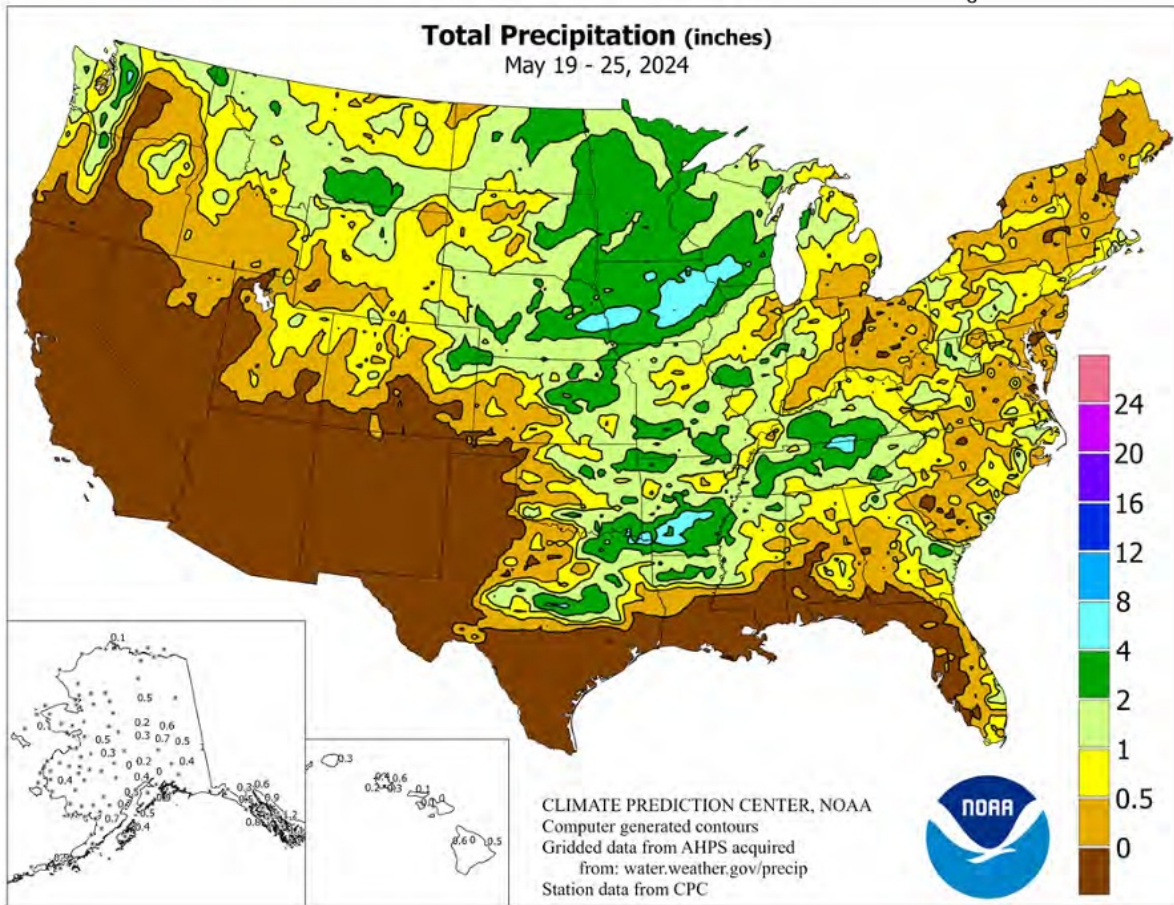
**WA** – Winter SW conditions are roughest in Washington where moisture has been short. It has rained recently but substantially more is needed to make the crop, which is “hanging on” at 10% excellent and 49% good and 46% headed. Spring SW seeding is complete and in better condition than the winter crop.

**OR** – USDA pegs the winter SW conditions at 10% excellent and 49% good.

## Weather Outlook



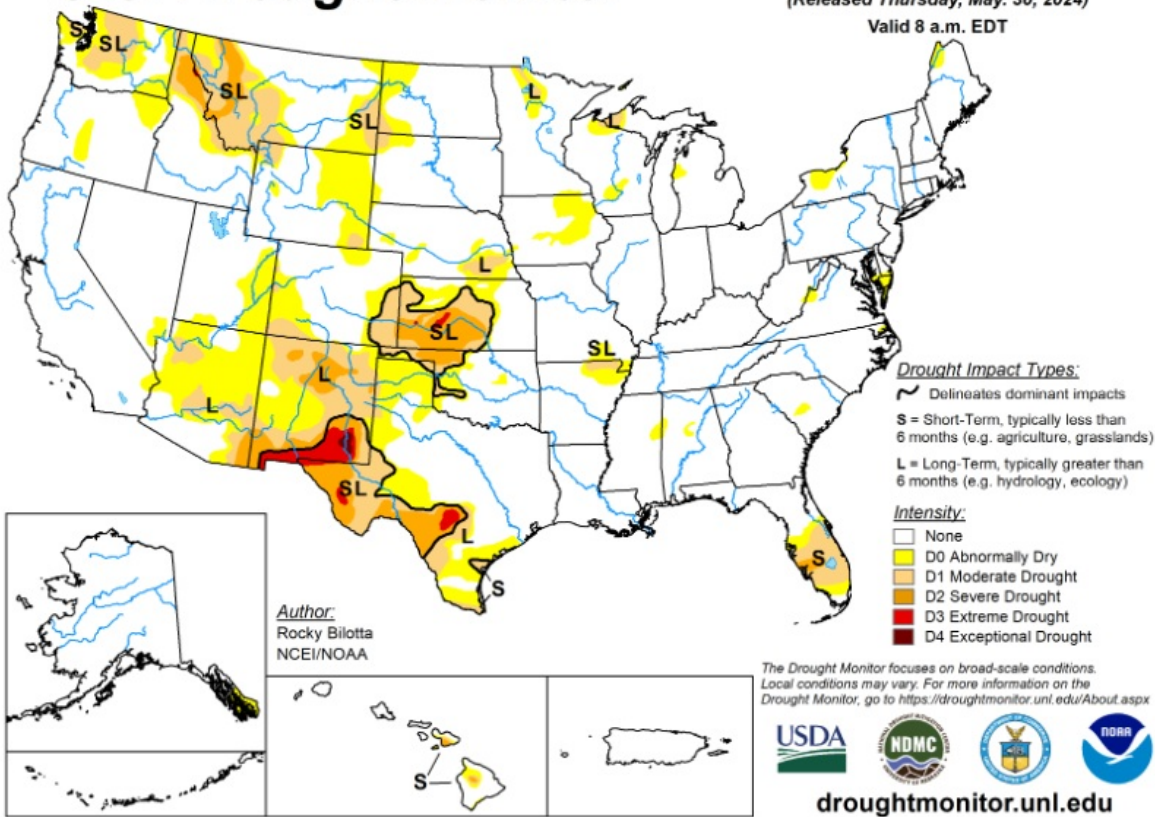
