HRW Harvest Update

June 21, 2024

State Updates

OH – Harvest in southern Ohio. Lower yields than we anticipated. Hot in May and June which made the crop mature earlier than we've seen in many years. This is the earliest we've started harvest probably since 90s.

MD – Heat wave (90s). Getting into harvest, some issues with vomitoxin and combine fires (result of very dry and hot weather, no humidity). Better than expected yields (80-90 bushel range). No TW/FN issues.

TX – I-35 est. 60% harvested, TW/yields drifting lower (40 bu/ac), TW 55 or lower. Major grain elevators taking everything as feed wheat. Variable sprout (4% or more). Rolling Plains – 90% harvested, quality issues in small pockets remaining. Panhandle - started end of last week, 50-60% harvested, widespread rainfall across region. Dryland 20-50 yields, irrigated 80+, good yields. TW 58-60, protein 12% or more.

OK – 83% harvested beginning of week, est. 90-92%. Panhandle region large amount of rain beginning of week (8-10 inches of moisture). 50-60% complete, most of dryland out, starting irrigated before rains came Tuesday. Irrigated 75-85 early cuttings, TW 60+. Monday at earliest before producers return to fields. Majority of state 60+, good quality, protein averaging 11.8 – 12% for entire region.

KS – Heavy widespread rain. A lot in SW KS. Forecast looks good, hot/windy – middle/end of next week. 28% complete, but est. closer to 40%. SRW harvest report releasing today – 70-130 bu/ac yields, some scab reports. Winter wheat yields very variable (15- 80 bushels).

CO – NASS conditions dropped slightly. Eastern CO - Hot/dry/windy (100 degrees with

30 MPH winds). SE state cutting Monday/Tuesday. Seeing good yields (15-40 bu/ac).

Cooler temps/trace rain, but hot/windy temps forecast.

WY – Went from mostly flowering to soft dough. Moisture needed. Slightly above avg. Further North may be slightly ahead of harvest, still 3.5 – 4 weeks out. Temps in 70s past few days.

ID – From all reports, SW in Northern ID “looks as good as it ever has” and is thriving. Cold snap on Monday / Tuesday cooled things off, but hot and dry temps are in the forecast going into next week. Some stripe rust in the north, but so far is ok. Wheat in southern Idaho got frost on Monday with high temperatures in the high 40s/low 50s, but we’re back to high 90s and dry again for the next week. The crop still looks good haven’t heard of any yield loss or damage from the freezing temperatures.

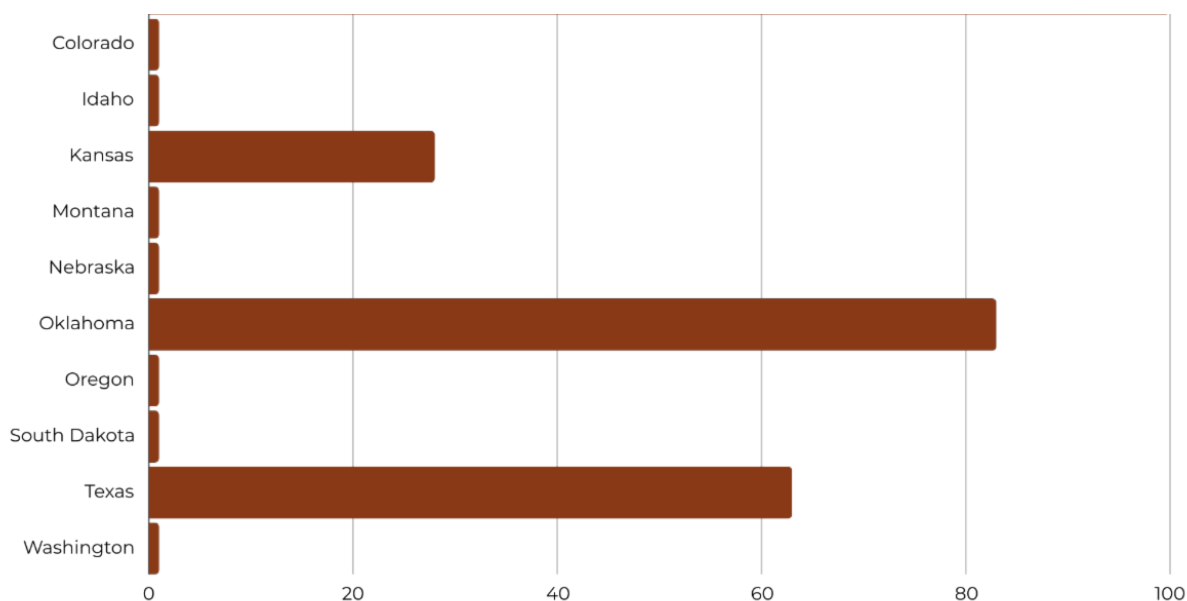
WA – Cool/wet weather past few days. Warmer forecast next week. NASS still lowering conditions. Slightly ahead of 5 year avg. in terms of heading/development. Some frost in certain areas past few days, but not seeing many impacts. A lot of weed pressure. Not many disease reports.

Winter Wheat Headed by State

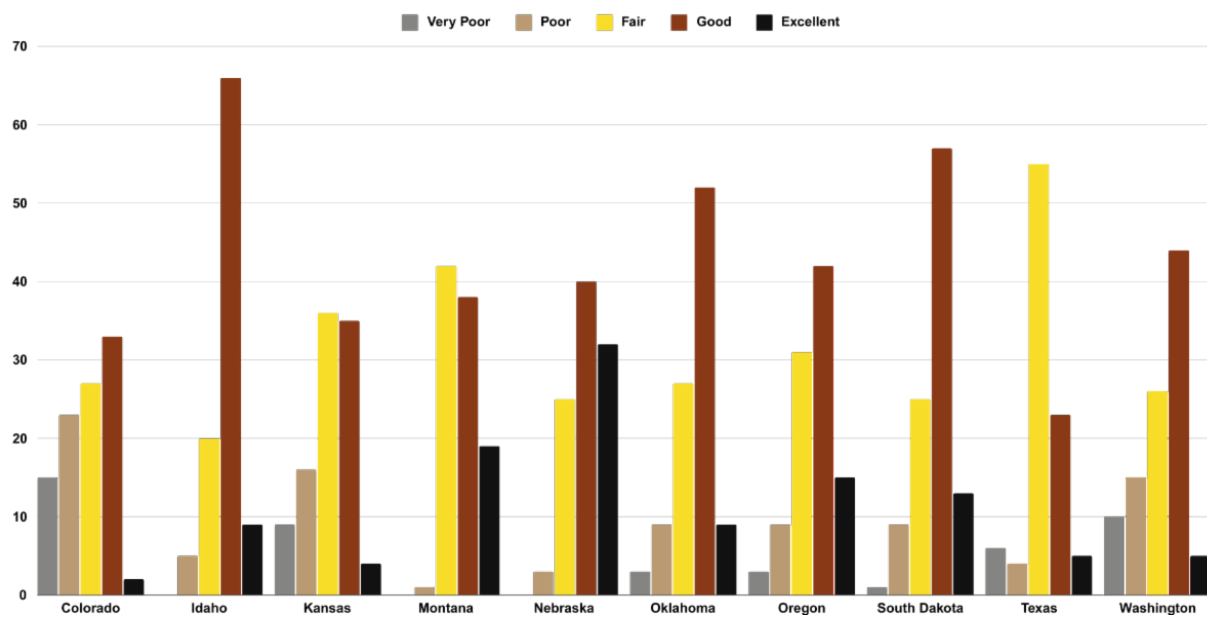

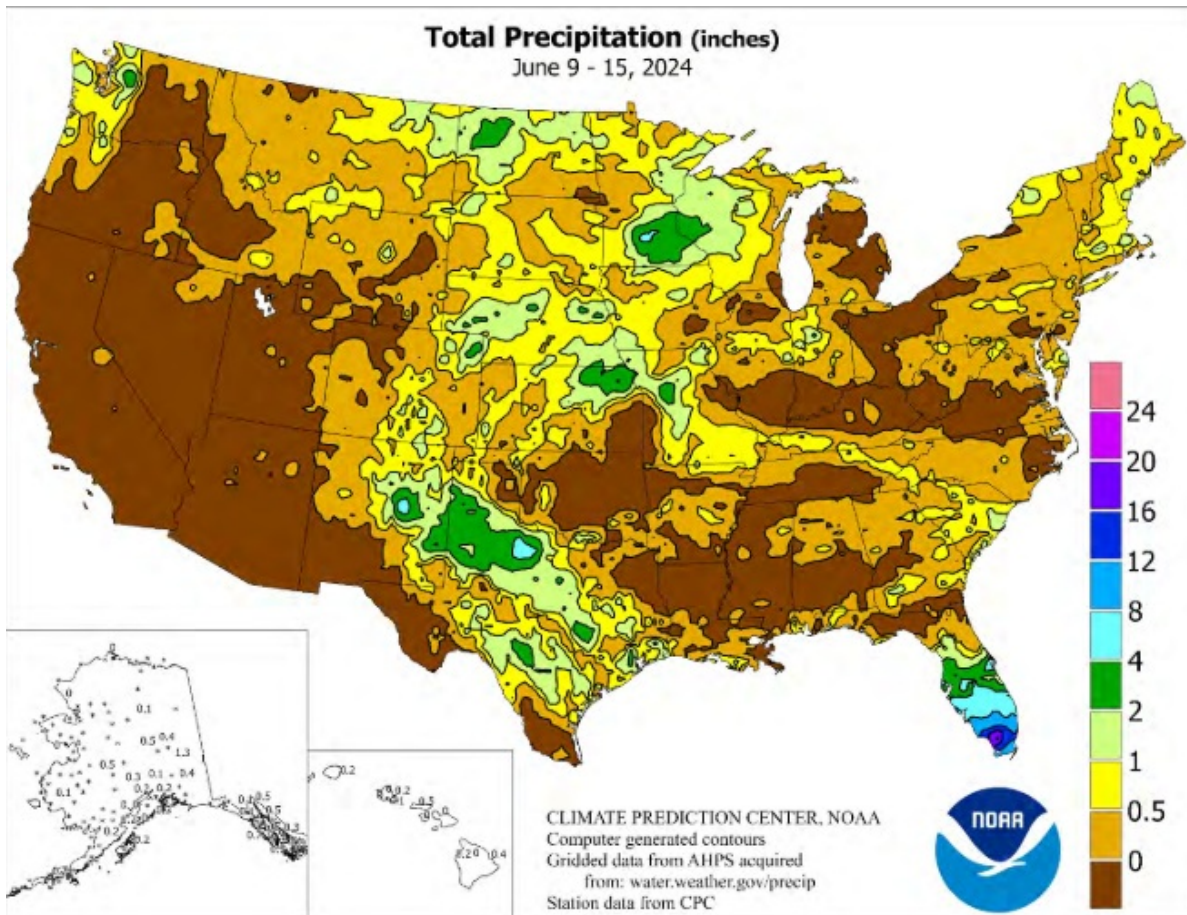
Winter Wheat Harvested by State

Weather Outlook

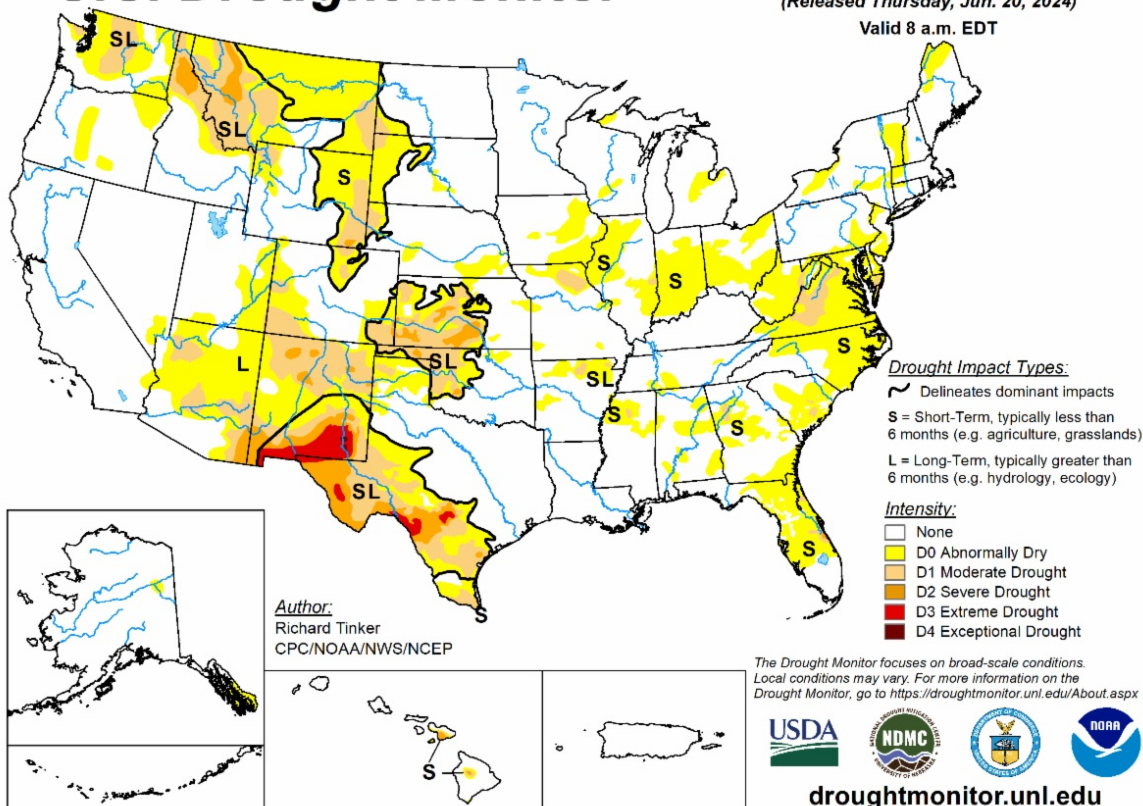


U.S. Drought Monitor

Oklahoma wheat harvest continues to move along in all areas of the state. Minor cutting continues in parts of Southwest Oklahoma down by Walters, Altus and Duke where rain hindered harvest in select areas. Elevator locations reporting a lot of movement over the weekend from South Central to North Central Oklahoma, progress has also been made in Northeast Oklahoma. In the Panhandle producers have made good progress with dryland harvest and are hoping to start in irrigated wheat over the next couple of days. Oklahoma Wheat Commission is calling wheat harvest for the state 87% complete.
